Security Systems

If your windows are connected to a security system, kindly deactivate it on the day of installation to prevent accidental triggering. Any alarms set off during the installation process are not the responsibility of Tidal Remodeling.

Noise Considerations

Window installation involves some noise due to drilling and other activities. Plan accordingly for this disruption, potentially scheduling time away from home during the installation process.

Safety of Children and Pets

For their safety, it's essential to keep children and pets away from the work area throughout the installation process.

Wall & Window Decorations

Remove any wall or window decorations near the installation site. Vibrations from the installation process could dislodge these items, potentially leading to damage.

Material & Sizing

Tidal Remodeling orders windows based on the specifications provided in our contract. Please remember that windows are custom-made items. Any adjustments or changes to the window order after installation may incur additional costs.

Cleaning

Our team will clean up the work area during and after the installation, but minor dust or debris may remain. We recommend conducting a final cleaning after the installation is complete.
