

## How to prepare for an Exterior Coating Project

### Remove Fragile Items

Remove all fragile items outside the house and garage. These items can fall during power washing if they are not firmly attached. We suggest that you check to make sure items are securely attached. If in doubt, take down or remove items.

### Perimeter of your house

Remove all important items around the perimeter of the house that could be sprayed such as cars, boats, furniture, barbecues, plants, flowers, sculptures, etc.

### Prepare for noise

There will be noise when power washing, patching, wood replacement and prepping are being conducted around your house. You may wish to plan time away on these days. You do not need to be home unless the production team informs you.

### Preparing for dust

Dust may also center around the exterior house due to wood replacement and sanding. It is recommended to store personal belongings in the garage or storage place before start date.

### Work Area

Please keep children and pets away from the work area until exterior coating is finished and completely dried.

### Gutters

We do not remove or replace gutters unless specified in writing in our agreement. Tidal is not responsible for damage to existing gutters in despair during regular project procedures, including hydro-blasting or painting.

### Cleaning

Our crew will perform cleaning during and after your exterior coating project. Please be advised during wood replacement some stubborn nails may remain hidden in bushes and grass around the house.

### Material Order

Tidal will order slightly more material than noted on your contract or scope of work. Our goal is to insure that we can complete your project in a timely manner. Any material left at the end of the project is property of Tidal. However, some left over Texcote coating will be left on site for homeowner in case future touch ups or repairs are needed.
